I was scheduled to proceed to the state Guest House as all the official business was after lunch. However, I chose to take an unscheduled detour (I had come to understand that such visits gave me a feel of the ground reality) to visit a government primary school. When I reached the school, it was lunch break and the mid-day meal was being served. When I introduced myself to the teacher, she looked at me incredulously. She couldn't believe that the Secretary had come to the school, unannounced. She

soon regained her composure and offered me the mid-day meal that was being served. Despite a short stint so far in the sector, I had heard horrid stories about the quality of such meals. Hence, I wanted to get a taste of it myself. When I did taste the food, I could not believe that such delicious food could be served as part of the mid-day meal. I jokingly told my wife, who was accompanying me, that even she didn't cook as delicious a meal. I inquired from the teacher about the source of this food. She said that it was being provided by Akshaya Patra. My ignorance about the organization was writ large on my face. The teacher was perceptive. She immediately gauged it and gave me a brief explanation about the organization that served this food."

Akshaya Patra and Trans Disciplinary University of Health Sciences and Technology join forces to combat India's Hidden Hunger



The Akshaya Patra Foundation (TAPF) and the Trans Disciplinary University of Health Sciences and Technology (TDU) have entered into a strategic collaboration aimed at addressing India's "hidden hunger" and enhancing nutrition for millions of children. The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was officially signed on October 5, 2024, and was unveiled during the Smart Protein Forum 2024, underscoring the profound impact this partnership will have on public feeding programs across India.

The partnership will focus on creating cost-effective, protein-rich meals using plant-based proteins like soy

and rice, with an emphasis on long shelf life and reduced operational costs. Additionally, it will analyze and enhance the nutritional value of meals to improve nutrient absorption while prioritizing sustainable ingredients such as millets. The collaboration will support policy improvements aimed at integrating nutrient-dense, cost-effective ingredients into public feeding programs like the PM POSHAN Scheme. Furthermore, workshops and training sessions will be conducted, along with the creation of school gardens, to raise awareness and share best practices on sustainable nutrition.

Nourish the Change: A Culinary Fundraiser with Master Chef Sanjeev Kapoor in Singapore









One of the pivotal stops for the delegation was Akshaya Patra's kitchen in Bangalore, the largest non-profit partner in India's mid-day meal programme. Akshaya Patra's innovative approach to serving high-quality meals at scale made a lasting impression on the Indonesian team.

The delegation also explored the roles of central and local governments in India's programme, taking note of the importance of synergy across various levels of administration.
